 SEWER SPECIAL ASSESSMENT BONDS

Said bids for the purchase of Tarabus Industrial Arm Extension No. 1 Sewer Special Assessment Bonds, to be issued by the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan of the par value of \$95,000 will be received by the undersigned, at the Township Hall, 31545 Eleven Mile Road, in said Township until 7:30 o'clock p.m., Eastern Daylight Time, on Tuesday the 5th day of September, 1967, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

Said bonds will be dated June 1, 1967, will be coupon bonds in the denomination of \$1,000 each, will be numbered consecutively in the direct order of their maturities from 1 up to 15, and will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding 5% per annum payable on December 1, 1967, and thereafter semi-annually on each June 1 and December 1. Each bid shall state the annual interest rate or rates upon which it is submitted, expressed in multiples of 1/8 of 1% The interest rate on any one bond shall be at one rate only and represented by one interest coupon for each coupon period, and all bonds maturing in the same year must carry the same interest rate. Accrued interest to date of delivery of such bonds must be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery. Both principal and interest will be payable at bank or trust company as shall be designated by the original purchaser of the bonds, which paying agent qualifies as such under the statutes of the State of Michigan or of the Federal Government.

The said bonds will mature serially on June 1 in each year as follows: \$6,000 in the year 1968; \$7,000 in each of the years 1969 thru 1972; \$6,000 in the year 1973; \$7,000 in each of the years 1974 thru 1977; \$6,000 in the year 1978; and \$7,000 in each of the years 1979 thru 1981. Bonds maturing prior to the year 1976 shall not be subject to redemption. The bonds of said issue maturing in the years 1976 thru 1981 shall be subject to redemption, at the option of the Township, in direct numerical order, on any one or more interest payment dates on and after June 1, 1975, at the par value thereof and accrued interest. Notice of redemption shall be given to the holders of bonds called for redemption at least once in a newspaper or publication circulated in the City of Detroit, Michigan, which carries as a part of its regular service, notices of the sales of municipal bonds. Bonds so called for redemption, provided funds are on hand with the paying agent to redeem the same. The said bonds are to be issued in anticipation of the collection of an equal amount of special assessments against lands in special assessment district No. 34, to defray the cost of constructing sanitary sewers in special assessment district No. 34, in the Township of Farmington, and in addition will pledge the full faith and credit of the Township for the payment of the principal and interest thereon. The township's taxing power to make such payment is without limitation as to rate or amount.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from October 1, 1967 to their respective maturities and deducting therefrom any premium. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the Township. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

A certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$1,900 drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Township Treasurer must accompany each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid be accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest shall be allowed on the good faith checks and checks of the unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of Dickinson, Wright, McKean & Cudlip, attorneys, Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds. The cost of said legal opinion and of the printing of the bonds will be paid by the Township. There will also be furnished the usual closing papers, including a notification certificate, dated as of delivery of the bonds. Bonds will be delivered at Detroit, Michigan, or such other place as may be agreed upon between the Township and the purchaser.

Kit's owner thinks the dog wandered out the front door three weeks ago and couldn't find her way back. The animal has never been allowed to run free without supervision.

The valuable canine is registered with the American Kennel Club under the official name Champion Chatte Brun du Val de Tommerre. It resembles a cross between a German Shepherd and a Collie and is known for its intelligence and trainability.

Five years ago, Kit was the first Belgian Tervuren in the metropolitan area. Over the years Miss Johnson has owned her, she has won firsts at dog shows in Canada as well as the United States.

Heart-broken with worry over her pet and companion, Miss Johnson has kept a constant check of want ads and dog pounds, but has found no trace of Kit.
