Westland Candidates Endorsed

Four Westland organiza-tions endorsed Mayor Thom-as Brown and a variety of candidates recently for the Sept. 12 Democratic primary election.

The League of Westland Democratic Voters Wednesday Aug. 16, voted 28-20 to renderse Brown over three challengers and City Council Candidates Justine Barris, incumbent, Gene McKinney, Russ Tuttle and Ralph Turco, all challengers. Also that week, the Westland Committee of Political Committee of the UAW-AFL endorsed Brown and three incumbent council members, William Anderson, Paul Krarup, Henry Lundquist, and challenger William Ventura.

The recommendations by the group's sterring committee were forwarded to the 15th District's COPE organization by Westland chairman Ben Delfart, and then sent to the Wayne County Council of UAW-ATL for approval. Westland political candidates were endorsed this week by the "Save Birch Hill Committee" and the Westland Teen Democratic Club.
