

# New Lecture Season On At Mercy

An inside look at Michigan Football, Wednesday, Sept. 8, opens the mid-day luncheon lecture series at Mercy College of Detroit.

Dave Diles, sports editor of WXYZ-TV, will master of ceremonies for a panel which includes William Clark Ford, president and owner of The Detroit Lions; Chalmers "Bump" Elliott, University of Michigan football coach; and Clarence "Biggie" Munn, athletic director at Michigan State University.

Following the panel discussion there will be a question and answer period as time permits. This is the pattern which will be followed in all attractions of the series.

Radio and television personalities, as well as outstanding authorities in specialized fields are featured in the series.

The football program is typical of the timeliness which guided the scheduling. Robert St. John, veteran foreign correspondent who is returning to the United States after covering the Israeli-Arab war, will speak Sept. 13, on "What's Next in the Middle East." St. John knows both sides for he has written biographies of both Israel's Ben Gurion and Egypt's Nasser.

Mark Lane, who appears Oct. 4, is author of "Rush to Judgment" and one of the outstanding critics of the Warren Report. He will speak at a time when District Attorney James K. Garrison is expected to begin what has been called, "The Shaw Conspiracy Trial" in New Orleans.

Robert E. Lee, playwright who wrote "Mame" appears shortly before the musical comedy comes to the Fisher Theater. Virginia Graham, who appears Nov. 13, has her own special "Girl Talk" appeal. The series closes May 1 with Francis Robinson, Manager of the National Company of the Metropolitan Opera, speaking on "What's New at the Met."
