

# Catholic Clergy and Laity Join Forces For New Program

A program unprecedented in the Roman Catholic church gets underway in the next few weeks in the Detroit archdiocese, including at least 16 churches in the archdiocese.

All have accepted the invitation of Archbishop John F. Darden to assist him in charting future plans—and for the first time lay members of the churches will be working with the clergy in such action.

They will be making proposals for a Synod to be held late next spring to bring about reform and renewal in keeping with the decrees of the second Vatican Council.

Traditionally, a Synod has included only a few representatives of the clergy, who aid the bishop in setting programs.

This time, lay Catholics will meet with priests—and in some cases—in a detailed study program. This will be done parish by parish, with all participants having an equal voice. Then reports will be sent to the archdiocese for the Synod.

The Synod-1988 preparatory program is titled the Parish Participation Plan, and will have as its theme: "Seeking Progress Together."

Beginning Sept. 17, and for three consecutive weeks, the parish communities will come together for special programs to be televised over the Archdiocesan Channel 8 and 10 and Detroit Educational Channel 58.

After the first three general meetings, parishes will divide into groups of 15 for "Speak Up" sessions. These groups will study and discuss specially-prepared booklets giving information based on the second Vatican Council and focused on specific topics—worship, clergy, laity, administration, community affairs, education, ecumenical affairs and missionary activity.

The hope is that all members of the parishes will make known their ideas in the "Speak Up" sessions, so that they can be incorporated in the reports to the Archbishop and he can know the minds of the parish members as well as the clergy.

Pastors in the area welcome the innovation as a means of knowing their parishioners better.

Father Ferdinand Wolbert, pastor of St. Genevieve parish in Livonia, said he considers the plan "a great opportunity for people to give voice to the renewal of the Church in our parish and Archdiocese of the 20th century."

"The priests are deeply interested in this project," he added. "We hope our parishioners' enthusiasm and sincerity will be of such caliber as to manifest the same interest."

Father James O'Hagan, pastor of St. Gerald parish in Farmington, said he was "glad to see the laity being given a greater voice in church legislation."

Several of the coordinating committees already are beginning meetings and formulating plans, and registration in the various parishes is taking place this month.
