ORDINANCE NO. 67-17 AN ORDINANCE TO CONTROL THE USE OF MOTOR CYCLES AND MOTOR SCOOTERS UPON RESIDENTIAL STREETS AND TO PREVENT EXCESSIVE EXHAUST NOISE ON ALL MOTOR VEHICLES.

THE VILLAGE OF QUAKERTOWN ORDAINS: Section 1. PURPOSE. In order to further secure and protect the general welfare and safety of the citizens of the Village of Quakertown...

Section 2. DEFINITIONS. Terms used: (a) The term "motorcycle" shall mean every motor vehicle having a saddle or seat for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than two wheels in contact with the ground...

Section 3. RESTRICTED OPERATION. (a) It shall be unlawful hereafter for any person to drive or operate a motor cycle or motor scooter upon any residential street in the Village of Quakertown...

Section 4. ENGINE EXHAUSTS. No person shall operate any motor vehicle within the Village of Quakertown unless said vehicle is equipped with an effective muffler in good working condition and in constant operation to prevent excessive or raucous noise.

Section 5. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts, portions and/or sections of this ordinance.

Section 6. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance, or failing to comply herewith, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not to exceed One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment for not exceeding ten (10) days in the county jail or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after publication hereof. Made and passed by the Village Council of the Village of Quakertown this 23rd day of August, 1967, A.D. ADOPTED: August 23, 1967. PUBLISHED: September 10, 1967. EFFECTIVE: September 10, 1967.
