Scholarships Offered In Home Management

Eight \$500 scholarships available to 1967 national winners in the 4-H Home Management program conducted by the Cooperative Extension Service.

The 4-H member having the best home management project in the state will be named a delegate to the National 4-H Club Congress in November, and receive an expense-paid trip to Chicago for the week-long session. Scores of 4-Hers throughout the state will earn the 4-H county medal of honor for making good progress in the management program.

All awards will be provided for the second year by Tupperware of Orlando, Fla., the program sponsor. Winners are selected by the Extension Service.

The home management program is one of the newest to be added to the long list of "learn-by-doing" programs available to all boys and girls between nine and 18 years of age who join 4-H.

The program stresses wise use of time, talent, money and resources through planning and management. Since so much cash flows through the fingers of today's youth, learning to manage money has high priority. Banking, checking accounts, budgeting and management are discussed at club meetings.

Some members make a project of caring for their own room, from daily upkeep to decorating and refurbishing. Other tasks involve the family, home chores, recreational activities, school and community responsibilities. All require "using what you have to get what you need and want," says a 4-H Home Management bulletin.
