# 4-H Clubs Have Changed Image

Creative writing, drawing, cooking, leather crafts, and dog training are things most people don't associate with a 4-H club. Times have changed and so has the image of 4-H clubs in Michigan.

Los Caballeros, Farmington's only 4-H club, is a mixture of both the country and the city. Besides projects like art, leather, and sewing they also have agricultural projects like horse training, outdoor cooking and gardening.

Mrs. Wilma Allmayer, 21505 Parker, Farmington, club leader, said that the club is eight-years-old and that it is the second largest club in Oakland County.

There are 35 4-H clubs in the county.

The club's biggest and most popular project is horses.

Mrs. Allmayer said that there are 60 members and that only 15 don't have horses.

Oakland County has the largest horse project in the entire state. This year five horses went from the county to the annual show Aug. 22 through 25 in Lansing.

All of the entrants were from Los Caballeros.

Los Caballeros members who competed in the horse show on Aug. 24 were Jim Kraft, club president, Leslie Neff, Pam Kocacal, Larry Steller, and Cathy Bush, all from Farmington.

Cathy Fewless, 12, 28084 Tyler, Southfield, took first place in the category indoor gardening.

Larry Steller 16, took first place on Aug. 22 in the small engine class. He overhauled a five-horse-power antique lawnmower.

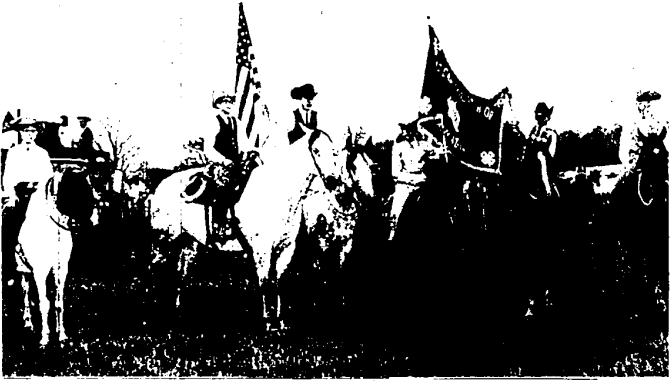
Linda Ciesla 12, 21950 Cass, Farmington, performed in a demonstration of outdoor cooking on Aug. 22.

Fortin, Mussatto and Mrs. Conlon have just completed a workshop sponsored by the county to inform new counselors of existing programs and services available to students and parents.

OCCUPATIONAL, educational and social information concerning counseling may be obtained at the Counselor Week information booth at Pontiac Mall from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. Sept. 27-30.

In county public schools, 350 counselors respect to the guidance and counseling needs of 120,000 students in junior and senior highs. Guidance and counseling programs at the elementary level are expected to soon increase the number of counselors.

The Oakland Area Counselors Association (O.A.C.A.) is the representative voice for school counselors of the county.

Dr. Robert Williams, director of guidance and measure-

ments Oakland schools and advisor to the O.A.C.A., has stated, "It is believed that the support of an informed public will add significantly to each counselor's effectiveness as he attempts to bring about guidance services to the students assigned to him."

IN OAKLAND County, most counselors' student assignment is 300-400 students.

Mrs. Virginia Vansan, chairman of the O.A.C.A., adds, "Our public image is important and we cannot take it for granted. We need to promote a general awareness on the part of the public of our various services."
