Youngsters Should Have Heroes

In the opinion of Weldon Petz, who will be principal of the new Forest Elementary School this year, youngsters today are missing out because they have no heroes.

"Today we have no hero worship," notes the administrator. "The closest we come to heroes these days are the astronauts. I think we use our strengths on the men who have become heroes. It is good to emulate a successful person's life."

Petz has made a life-long study of his own hero—Abraham Lincoln—and comments, "Even Lincoln had many heroes."

"My interest in Lincoln goes all the way back to when I was 12 years old. I have studied Lincoln in the professional way for more than 20 years."

PETZ'S COLLECTION of Lincoln memorabilia includes 8,000 pictures and over 1,000 books. He recently sold 400 books because he had no room to house them.

He feels that one of his rarest pieces is a November 1860 Detroit Advertiser covering Lincoln's election. His pupils are fascinated by the fact that the century-old paper reports that Farmington voted against Lincoln for president.

Another treasure is a peach pit carved into a Lincoln likeness by a Union soldier imprisoned in Andersonville. Two others like it are in

Lincoln's newest Lincoln place is a painting of the president by Shirley Ford which Bond School parents commissioned as a gift for Petz when he was principal of the school last year.

Sometime during the year, Petz will no doubt talk to his pupils about his hero. He has spoken to over 300 children's groups about Lincoln.

He feels today's children can learn important fundamentals from study of the man.

He lists these as, "Simplicity, directness, honesty and the knowledge that a man can achieve greatness no matter what the circumstances of his birth."
