Farmington Group Buys State Bank

A 50-year-old bank in the northern part of Michigan has been purchased by a limited partnership with the general partner listed as Thomas A. Duke, the Farmington developer.

Purchased was The Charlevoix State Savings which has assets "approaching \$4 million."

The purchase was announced at a recent meeting of the Board of Directors.

At the same meeting Duke was elected chairman of the board. Added to the bank's board at the meeting were: William M. Skillman, an accountant who lives in Farmington; Township Attorney Joseph T. Brennan; Eldon H. Henderson, chairman of the Board of Yale Rubber Co. of Sandusky, O.; and Jerred H. Redeker, former vice president of the Metropolitan National Bank of Farmington. Duke is currently the Chairman of the Board of the Metropolitan Bank.

Duke said that the partners had bought more than 50 percent of the Charlevoix bank's stock as a long term investment.

In addition to the interest in the two banks, Duke is also the developer of the River Glen, Brookdale Club and Independence Green apartments in Farmington.
