### OLS Takes Four From Farmington Trophies

Farmington's Our Lady of Sorrows High School qualified more students for participation in the First Annual Michigan Student Congress than any other school in the State.

The Student Congress was held in Lansing at the State Capitol Building Sept. 29 and 30.

Three Sorrows students received superior ratings at the University of Michigan regional discussion contest last May, which entitled them to go to Lansing to discuss the topic: "What approaches to combating crime should be adopted by the Federal Government."

The three students are: John Abowd, junior; Brian Pollins, senior; and Gary Maximuk, junior.

Pollins was named Speaker of the House.

The student congress also discussed legislation dealing with gambling, narcotics, and wiretapping.

Abowd and Pollins came home with two trophies each, giving Sorrows twice as many trophies as any other school represented.

This was part of the Sorrows debate and discussion program.

### NDEA Funds Increase Equipment For School

A professional resource center stocked with \$85,000 of instructional films and \$44,000 of projectors, duplicators was secured for Oakland Schools today with the approval of matching funds from National Defense Education Act appropriations.

Films will be available for use in all school districts of Oakland County. Equipment will be kept at the Media Center.

The auxiliary meets monthly at the post home and has a varied program.

It helps care for approximately 5,500 veterans in veterans' hospitals, works at the National Home in Elgin Rapids, where 200 orphans and 15 widows of veterans are cared for and aids veterans' children who have become delinquent.

Children of post members are active in the "Miss Americanism" project and take part in many parades.

### Strike Ended At Diamond

The seven-week strike that plagued Diamond Automation, 2500 Haggerty Rd. in Farmington, ended last night.

The strike was ended by Teamsters Local 614.

A 30 month contract was ratified by the union with a vote of 107 yes and 23 against.

John Taylor, manufacturing manager for Diamond, said, "I think we have a liveable agreement. Both sides negotiated in good faith and we are pleased with the settlement."

Teamsters Local 614 President, Joseph Bane, said, "We didn't get all that we bargained for this year."

The teamsters were striking for a pension plan and a cost of living benefit neither of which were received.

However, the union did manage to get a pay raise of 21 cents an hour for all classifications and 25 cents an hour for leaders.

They received an additional \$2,000 life insurance and \$1,000 in accident insurance.

The company also agreed to pay all Blue Cross expenses for one year if an employee is disabled on the job.
