The Youth Guidance Com-mittee of Greater Farmington received an unexpected rebuff from the Township Board last week on its request for an en-dorsement of a contemplated program expansion.

and implementation of the Community Program' propos-al presented this summer. "This pilot program, and subsequent adoption of the Mott Community Schools Flam, has rectived fav or able comment from those who attended the two schobuled presentations.

two scheduled presentations, 'Our pilds program, to be financed from community con-tributions and matching Moti Foundation funds, is designed to test the pilot project con-cepts. More importantly, it should serve the purpose of "seiling" the idea to the com-munity so that a millage may be eventually successful. "We would hope to have a formal expression of support, or at least of opinion, by our

three sponsoring bodies before proceeding." The other "sponsoring bodies" to which reference was made are the City Council and Board of Education, neither of which has yet reacted offici-ally to the same proposal.

UPON UNAIMAGUS instruc-tion from his fellow irustees, Township Supervisor Curtis Hall sent Alstrom the follow-ing dispatch, reflecting board irritation at the committee's plan:
