Jonathan Bloomberg received his bear badge and one gold arrow and Lon Stewart received a gold arrow for his bear badge. Webelos awards were presented

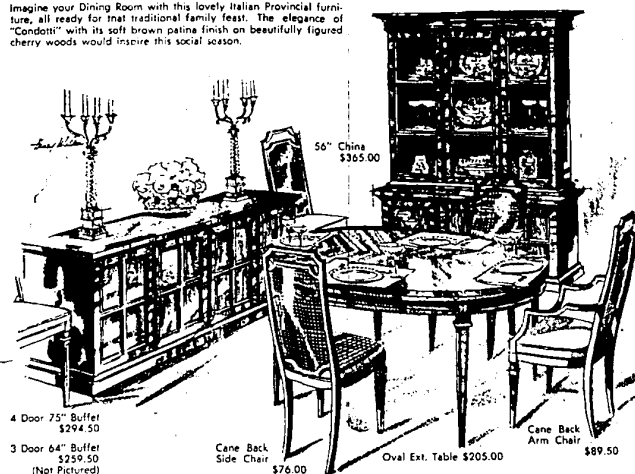

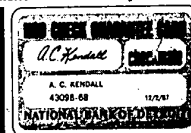
