Northern Michigan's Flatte River, Bear Creek, and Big Huron River will remain clos-ed to all fishing until fall spawn-ing runs of cohe salmon are played out, the Conservation Department reports.

The three streams fishing ban is being continued under special Department orders so that the fish can spawn undisturbed in wholesale numbers.

Department Fish Chief Wayne
H. Tody explains: "We have succeeded in collecting all the coho eggs we need and have met requirements of trans-ferring about 20,000 surplus spawners to experiment with their natural reproduction in eight new streams."
Tody says it is very im-portant to let the fish spawn without angling interference which originally disrupted coho runs and forced the Department to suspend fishing in the Platte River, Bear Creek, and Big Buron River.
