

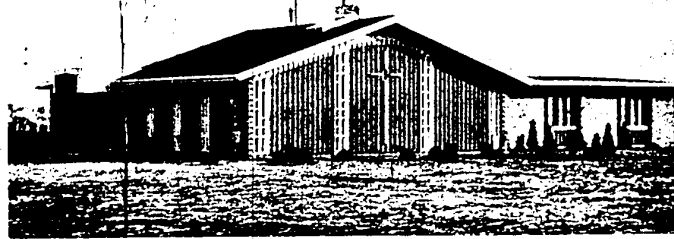
Family Dance Weekend Set

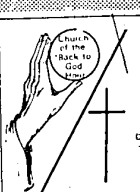

St. Timothy Dedication Set Sunday

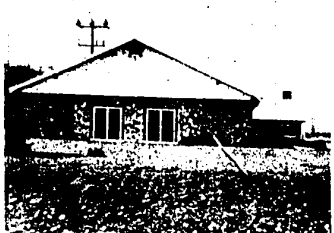

Phone Booth Gives Teen Privacy

Because teen-age is phone time, teenagers and their families are entitled to privacy during talk-fests. The "teenie" doesn't want to be heard, and the family doesn't want to listen. Too often the telephone is located where privacy is absent. It's downright embarrassing! To avoid this problem, Dad can put together a portable telephone booth which can be placed on a desk or on the floor to isolate the talker. Even Mom will find it useful to screen out unwanted noises. Here's how to make it: Using 1x2-inch lumber, build three frames. The center one back of the booth will be 24 inches long and 18 inches high. Hinged to it are two wings, each 13 inches long and 18 inches high. When not in use, the booth can be folded up and put away. Both sides of each frame are covered with Masonite 1/4" Patterned Peg-Board. This prefabricated board becomes an acoustic barrier when insulating blanket material is placed between the panels. Paint the framework and add the hinges. You'll have a neat-looking accessory that will keep teenagers and family happy during those long telephone talks.
