## NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF FARMINGTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a special election has been called to be held in Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland, and State of Michigan, on Monday, the 27th day of November, 1967, to vote upon the following propositions:

### A. BOND PROPOSITION

Shall Farmington Public School District, Oakland County, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Nine Million Dollars (\$9,000,000) and issue its bonds therefor, for the purpose of defraying the cost of erecting, furnishing and equipping a new senior high school building, a new junior high school building, new elementary school buildings, and additions to existing school buildings; completing school buildings and the furnishing and equipping thereof; and acquiring and developing sites and making other permanent improvements?

### B. OPERATING MILLAGE INCREASE PROPOSITION

In order to provide additional operating funds, shall the limitation on the total amount of general ad valorem taxes which may be imposed for all purposes in any one year upon real and tangible personal property in Farmington Public School District, Oakland County, Michigan, be increased as provided in Section 4, Article IX, of the Constitution of Michigan, for a period of ten (10) years from 1968 to 1977 both inclusive, by five (5) mills on each dollar (\$5.00 per \$1,000) of the assessed valuation of property as finally equalized, for the purpose of defraying a part of the operating expenses of the school district?

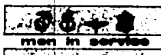
