

Hare said be had received some inquiries from persons who felt that continuing the old system of filling out the application manually at a branch office of the secretary of state as in previous years would save money.

"Certainly, going to a prepared application this year means an increased expenditure," he saied. HARE SAID even though prepared applications would cost more the first year, savings over "the long haul" would be "substantial."

"Previously, vehicle infor-

nover "the long haul" would be "substantial." "Previously, vehicle information was captured on a catch-as-catch_can, year-to-year basis and typed out manually. This resulted in many inaccuracies as well as a slow, cumbersome process. "But once the information is captured on a particular vehicle, it will become a part of a permanent computerized file available to official agencies on a moment's notice," Hare said, "What's most important, the information will be correct." He said mechanization of the vehicle files would eliminate long and coosity and oftentimes

He said mechanization of the vehicle files would eliminate long and costly and oftentimes inaccurate typing, and the state's tarpayers will be saving an estimated \$300,00 per year when the program gets into full swing.

In THE LAW enforcement area, Hare termed the information an inavituable tool for police agencies.

"In a few seconds, our computer can ferred out information and send it on a direct line to state police or other police agencies on stolen cars by listing the correct serial number and complete description of the vehicle."

An important on, says Hare, is that it saves time and effort on the part of many of the state's vehicle owners when they buy their new license plates.
