The person making the comment was John Richardson, chairman of the Future Farmington Area Study Group. This committee has been trying to have a study made of governmental alternatives since last spring.

OPPERTIAUSER'S proposal provides some legal basis to preserve the boundary setuate doe. It is palatable only if enough time is allowed before the election for the completion of lan area-wide study and if the voter has time to digest the findings.

If the election were to be set before there was time to digest the contents of the study (and we hope that one is made soon), then the Opperthauser proposal should be turned down.
