

# Both Back Poverty Bill, Reasons Differ

Both Republican Congressman from the Observer area voted last week for the anti-poverty program, but they differed on some points.

"I supported the \$2.08 billion bill," said Rep. Marvin E. Schmitt (2nd District).

"I voted in favor of the bill at a holding of \$1.6 billion," said Rep. Jack McDonald of

utilizing private industry. Each cited GOP-sponsored amendments that would have (1) placed counselors in communities to work as liaisons between industry and schools and (2) given industry incentives to provide on-the-job training of the poor. Both amendments were defeated.

And both opposed an amendment to give control of community action programs to cities. Each said that proposal, which passed, was backed by a coalition of "big city and southern Democrats."
