

# 691,000 Answer Survey

Michigan's mail survey of fallout protection in homes in 72 cities is nearing the halfway mark with more than 691,000 questionnaires having been returned to the U.S. Census Bureau, Col. Frederick E. Davide, State Police and state civil defense director, reported.

In addition, 908,947 homes have been visited by Census Bureau enumerators in other areas. This part of the survey is completed, with a 99.8 per cent coverage.

The mail returns represent 45.9 per cent of the 1.5 million questionnaires sent to the occupants of one, two and three family dwellings in the state's cities having 10,000 or more population.

The confidential survey, in which Michigan and federal civil defense officials and the Census Bureau are cooperating, began Oct. 19 by mail in the cities and by interviewers in the other areas. The cost is being paid by the federal government.

Civil Defense officials reemphasize that the fallout protection survey gives individuals and families another good opportunity to learn how to protect themselves in any nuclear radiation emergency.

The survey will have two direct benefits: One, cooperating households will be confidentially advised of the protection their homes afford and how it may be improved; two, the availability of protection for people in their homes will importantly assist in the planning of community shelters.

Persons who have not yet filled out their questionnaires should complete and mail them in the envelope provided to the Census Bureau at Jeffersonville, Ind., where they are being processed by computer.

## Lincoln-Mercury Sales Take Dip

Lincoln-Mercury sales during Nov. 11-20 were 2,923, compared to 11,803 in the same period of 1966, the division has announced.

"The worst is behind us now and we expect to make a dramatic turnaround in the coming weeks," E. F. (Gar) Laus, Ford Motor Company vice president and division general manager, said. "By next week we will be building more than 2,000 cars per day and dealer inventories will increase steadily, permitting a substantial improvement in sales by the end of the year."

Deliveries since Jan. 1 totaled 295,743, against 318,477 a year ago.

The division announcement made no mention of the six-week strike of the UAW.
