

Livingston, Hamlin Win Spots With Conference All-Stars

KALAMAZOO — A pair of Western Michigan University football players from Overland have been named to the Mid-American all-conference football team.

Junior center Gene Hamlin of Redford (Redford Union) was picked as a center on the offensive first team and senior Dale Livingston, of Plymouth, was named the team's kicking specialist for the second straight year.

Also grabbing first team berths for the Broncos were defensive end Jerry Collins of Muskegon and rover Back Dave Hudson of Battle Creek.

The selections of Hamlin and Livingston resulted from much praise from the Mid-American coaches who picked the team.

ALTHOUGH HE missed half the season because of a leg injury, the 6-2, 248-pound Hamlin was selected as one of the first-team centers along with Paul Krasula of Miami.

Hamlin was injured in the 35-9 loss to Toledo and missed the last three games of the season but league coaches felt he did such a good job they selected him to the team.

Hamlin, who also earned all-conference honors while at Redford Union High School, was one of the Broncos' most versatile performers, playing first string at either center or tackle. He was an All-MAC second-team selection last season at center. Livingston's selection was no surprise but the acclaim he received was not expected. He was a unanimous selection and the coaches felt he was so outstanding that they didn't even bother to name a kicking specialist to the second team.

Livingston's second straight

first-team berth capped a tremendous career that saw him move from the intramural playing field to a role as one of the nation's top collegiate kickers.
