News Round Up

THEASTEY officials said Tuesday that no attempt will be made by the United States to collect the repayment of France's B., 28. billion World War I debt as urged by Pep, Lester Wolff, (D.-N.). The officials said that politics and the world economic system prevent the U.S. from demanding the principal and interest France still owes this country, Wolff's call, came in the wake of President Charles DeGaulle's among last week for a worldwide gold standard, DeGaulle also criticized the U.S. for attempting to control European Industry through invistments.

WASHINGTON sources stated that North Vietnam is ex-periencing a food shortage due to the intensified U.S. air at-tacks on North Vietnam roads which apparently disrupted this year's [tice harvest, infelligence reports say that the North Vietnamese rice harvest has been poor for two years and that the fold istuation might have worsened, Authorities de-clined to say how this information was gathered.

• OVER 1,000 anti-war demonstrators were frustrated by over 4,000 solice in New York recently at the antiwar group's second attenting to disrupt activities at an armed forces induction center. The police kept the mass of protesters broken into small groups and here'de them behind barricades in Lower Manhattan. The demonstration lasted only for three hours, and just a score of persons were arrested as compared to 264 the previous risk. In Philadelphia, police hauded away 70 demonstrators who tried to block a door to an induction center.

• N BUFFALO, N.Y., nine porsons were arrested in antimotost that drew levers from onlowers. There were also
counter-pickets at San Fernando Valley State College, where
anti-war pickets were protesting the campus presence of Dor
Chomical Co, job recruiters, All demonstrations were part
of a national "Stop The Draft Week," project spannord by a
coalition of some 50 anti-war and civil rights groups.

STUNELY Carmichael, a black power leader for SNCC, was granted a visa by French authorities to address a Vietnam War protest meeting in Paris after being held at Orly Airport owernight. The controversial leader was held at the airport after an interior Ministry official said his presence in France was undestplade. The bax was lifted while his case was considered by higher authorities at the Foreign Ministry.

THE (NO. 4 official in the State Department and the high-ost ranking diplomat in the foreign service, Foy D, Kohler, will be rejuded as deputy undersecretary of state for po-litical affairs by Charles E, Bohlen, who is currently am-bassador to France. The white House amnounced that Kohler is rettring to become a professor at the University of Miami's Center for Avianced International Affairs.

CYRUS VANCE, 50, one of President Johnson's number one trouble-hooters who recently helped resolve the dispute butween Greece and Turkey over the Island of Cyprus, has been touted as the most likely candidate to succeed Deinas Secretary lobert S, McNamara, Vance recently told enwamen that his being considered for the top job was "out of the question," As reputy defense secretary from Jan, 9, 1964 to June 30, 1967, he handled many of the touchy jobs involving the military services and Congress.

. ALABAMA Gov, Lurleen Wallace took another poke at Washington when she predicted "The people are ultimately going to clame the effect" of a U.S. Supreme Court ruling upholding court-ordered desegregation in Alabama's public schools, Sything another blow for "state" rights", Wallace called the ruling, "a part of the master plan being pushed and sponsored by the enemies of our Constitution to nationalize our schools,"

A SECOND attempt to transplant a human heart ended in failure Wednesday when a 2 1/2 week old boy lived for only seven hours with a heart from a dead two-day old infant, br. Adrian Nashrowitz, who performed the infant transplant at the Maimonides Medical Center in Brooklyn said that the child born at the hospital had a lesion that blocked the entrance to the heart's left ventrical and could not have been repaired by surgery. Wednesday's failure came four days after doctors at the Groote Schum! Hospital in Capetown, South Afrida, announced the first human heart transplant in which a 51-year-old grocer, Louis Washansky, received the heart of 2 year old traffic accident victim, Denise Darvail.

OFFIC ALS OF the 36,500 member Associated Society of Locomodive Engineers and Firemen ended a two day slowdown that lifed up much of southern England's rail traffic when the union accepted a peace formula proposed by Prime Minister Harold Wilson. The union was protesting, with their slowdown, the stationing of brakemen from the rival National Union of Railwaymer in the rear of diesel locomotives,




