City Councilman John Allen asked his fellow Council members to adopt a resolution supporting the proposed legislation. "To have private opinions different than public opinions is hypocrisy." he asserted.

Less than one percent of Greater Farmington's \$4,500 residents turned out last weekend to hear about the proposed legislation. That really isn't a bad attendance figure when you stop to think that 120 people is a pretty good turnout for a Sunday afternoon meeting.

The fact that the City Council refused to support the resolution is unfortunate. However, the proposed bill does have some loopholes and we can sympathize with Mayor Wilbur V. Brotherton when he says that "Il personally cannot come to a decision on this bill."
