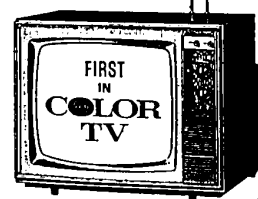

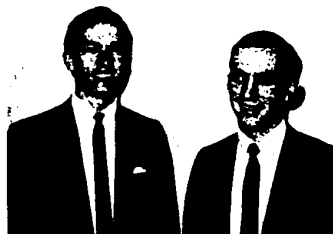
Young Missionaries Assigned By Mormons

Elder Ronald Pugh, 21, from Henderson, Nev., and Elder Steve Stratton, 20, of St. George, Utah, have been assigned to the Livonia area as missionaries for the Mormon church and will be working in and around Livonia for several months.

The opportunity to serve as a missionary of the church is offered to both young men and young women at the age of 19 to 21. If accepted, they are sent to Salt Lake City for a week of orientation and then sent to their assigned area of labor to serve two years at their own expense as full-time missionaries.

Young men selected are ordained to the office of elder before receiving their assignments.

ELDER PUGH and Elder Stratton will be going door to door each day, offering to share as much information as the householder desires to know concerning their religion. If no interest is shown they will express appreciation of the time

granted them and go on to the next visit.

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints has grown from six members to almost 3,000,000 members since its organization in 1830.

AT PRESENT the church is completing a new chapel at the corner of Six Mile and Merriman Road, with plans for its dedication and open house late next month.

Local members are donating their labor to the building, and services are being held in Thurston High School, Redford Township.

R. Ettinger To Speak In Beth Am

Robert Ettinger, author of the controversial book "The Prospect of Immortality," will speak at the Sabbath service for Temple Beth Am at 8:30 p.m., Friday, Dec. 22, in the Cohen Building, Osmus at Seven Mile.

Ettinger has advanced the idea that it is possible to freeze the newly dead in expectation of eventual revival, repair and rejuvenation.

His topic for this talk will

be "The Promise and Threat of Immortality." He is expected to deal with such matters as the legal aspects of the question and the church's attitude.

The public is invited to attend the talk before the Beth Am congregation. One spokesman commented:

"He is a fine speaker with a fascinating subject. One does not have to agree to find himself involved. Most impor-

tant, it causes one to think, and in these times that is an almost lost art."

Volunteer Service Popular

Americans have high regard for the volunteer spirit, and they strongly favor volunteers working in the war on poverty according to a Gallup survey just released.

The Gallup organization asked Americans how they felt about their children volunteering for service overseas in the Peace Corps or in VISTA (Volunteers in Service to America), an Office of Economic Opportunity Program that sends volunteers to serve among the poor in America.

Nine out of ten favored volunteer service for youth. Seventy-four per cent, when asked, chose one of the programs. Sixteen per cent said it made no difference which program their child had. Those and 10 per cent had no opinion.

BY NEARLY two to one, they would choose VISTA service for their sons over service in the Peace Corps — 47 per cent to 27 per cent. Two out of three reflected the American axiom "Charity begins at home" when they said their choice of VISTA was because "it helps people in this country."

Recruitment figures of the two agencies seem to bear this out. A Peace Corps official revealed in a news story this past week that applications to the Peace Corps are down 30 per cent over the past year. He said the decline is because conditions "have made Americans cynical about their ability to change anything in the world."

The opposite situation prevails at VISTA, where applications are up 34 per cent over the past year, based on September, October, and November figures, the latest available.

RECRUITMENT DIRECTOR Alexander Grant reports that "in November, about our applications were up 62 per cent this year, and since July we have received 37,564 written inquiries about VISTA service, a 75 per cent increase in inquiries over last year."

People who knew something about VISTA and said they would be interested in seeing their sons serve had a variety of comments.

"It's a domestic Peace Corps where you go into ghettos and help solve problems," was the VISTA definition given to Gallup by a 28-year-old businessman in Illinois.

The wife of a store manager in Texas said, "Well, they're calling for Americans to help Americans—a nice idea. I'd like to do it if I didn't have small children of my own."
