Farmington residents will have numerous opportunities to celebrate the eve of the birth of Christ Dec. 24.

Many of the churches in the community have planned special services Christmas Eve.

Baptist churches holding observances include North Farmington Baptist Church, which has planned a Christmas Eve candlelight service at 7 p.m. All area Catholic churches will hold midnight Mass Christmas Eve with Our Lady of Sorrows also planning a Mass of Thanksgiving at 1 a.m. Dec. 25.

The Church of St. Fabian will have hymn singing at 11:30 Dec. 24 followed by a procession to the crib at 11:50 and Mass at midnight.

Mass at the Catholic churches will not follow the regular Sunday schedules on Christmas Day, so it is suggested that residents wishing to attend check with their churches.

Trinity Episcopal Church will hold a service of lessons and carols with the junior choir at

4 p.m. Dec. 24 and a service of carols and communion at 11 p.m. that night. A communion service is planned at 10:30 a.m. Christmas Day.

Lutherans may attend a 7:30 p.m. candlelight service Dec. 24 and worship services at 11 a.m. Dec. 25 in St. John American Lutheran Church.

Antioch Lutheran Church will hold a traditional candlelight service at 11 p.m. Christmas Eve and join the Lutheran Church of the Incarnation in services in Incarnation at 10 a.m. Christmas morning. The Rev. Peter C. Larsen will officiate.

Prince of Peace Lutheran Church will observe Christmas Eve at 8 p.m. with "Christmas Around the World," a candlelight service with ethnic carols.

## Brennan Home On Leave

Talking to Jim Brennan, 21, a specialist 4, home on leave from Vietnam, makes you feel like the Viet Cong are looking over your shoulder.

A helicopter crew chief, working at helicopter ambulance "hot-spots" (carrying wounded from the battle field), Brennan has seen Viet action on every war front.

He arrived home on 40-day leave Dec. 1, and is visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. James Brennan, of Walled Lake, formerly of Litch Ave. here in Farmington.

HE DESCRIBES helicopter duty as a "24-hour, seven day a week job" and says his base is Nha Trang but he "seldom sees it." When working at picking up the wounded, the helicopter crew sleeps in the copter and lives off of C-rations.

Brennan calls this conflict a "helicopter war. The helicopter is life or death and a savior to the ground troops." He says he was surprised when he came home after 14 months in Vietnam to learn that the draft-card-burners were such a minority group.

"Over there," he says, "we don't get the good news as much as we get the bad."

His sister, "Twenty-nine percent of the guys over there would like to go right on to Hanoi. It's got to be one way or the other."

A GRADUATE of Our Lady of Sorrows, Brennan has a sister who is a nun at St. Luke's Catholic Church in Flint.

The first thing he did when he got home was call Sister James Renee.

Asked if she prays for him, he commented, "I wish she'd stop."

But Sister James Renee's prayers must be heard, Brennan's helicopter was shot from under him two days before he began his leave and he's here to tell about it.
