Before painting, make sure all surfaces are clean. Dusting will suffice for most areas, built for the kitchen, bait room out wa a dw ork with a house-hold detergent and water is a must. Full all cracks and holes with a patching compound is dry, sand even with the surface. Roughen surfaces that are too glossy with fine grained samo paper and you will allere beautifully.
