

National News Round Up

IN A POLICY change, the U.S. has shown its intention to break North Vietnam's will to fight by permitting American pilots to fly through a formerly restricted buffer zone along the China's border. Previously, policy was limited to smashing supply lines. Bombing is still forbidden to docks in Haiphong, North Vietnam's primary port. Meanwhile, American troops repelled an attack by 500 Communists at an outpost near the Cambodian border.

THE U.N. GENERAL ASSEMBLY gave unanimous approval to a treaty providing for the rescue and safe return of astronauts. The Soviet Union and United States had joined forces to win its acceptance.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON signed an order to cut federal spending by \$4.3 billion—a move that may lead to congressional passage of a tax increase. Congressmen have been reluctant to lift taxes as an anti-inflation measure until the administration has shown some signs of cutting spending.

GREECE'S KING CONSTANTINE, exiled in Rome, is under pressure to make an agreement with the military government he attempted unsuccessfully to oust before a new constitution is submitted to the government. The government wants him back, but only as a figurehead. Constantine reportedly wants free elections, an assurance of no reprisals against those who supported his attempted coup, and a promise that Premier Papadopoulos will leave the government.

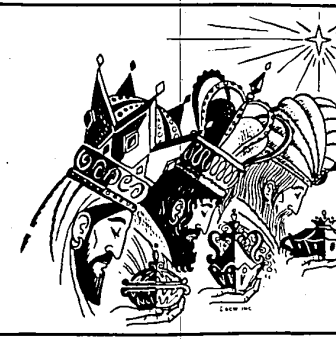

A new bridge carrying M-35 over the Escanaba River in Ontonagon was opened to traffic recently, the State Highway Commission reports. The new bridge, built at a cost of \$289,000, replaces a one-lane steel bridge built in the early part of the century. 
