Scouts To Spend Fitness Month

Personal fitness will be the program theme in January for the 126 Boy Scout troops in the Clinton Valley Council, Boy Scouts of America.
Ten-year-old Wabelos Scouts also will be working in January on requirements for the new athletic activity badge.
The 122 Cub Scout packs in the council will build den and pack meetings around the theme of communications. Crafts, trips and skits will be included in the month's activities.
Juan J. Vargas, of Mt. Clemens, who is Scout Commissioner of the Clinton Valley Council, said that the Boy Scouts of America considers physical fit-

ness a major objective of the Scout program. The fitness program calls for Scouts to have a medical checkup, physical testing, Scouting activities to improve fitness and periodic re-testing.
The highlight event in January for Boy Scouts will be a Conservation Good Turn -- a weekend hike or camp-out. Many troops are expected to conduct winter wildlife counts to determine what kinds of animals live in or near the area being surveyed, to find out the relative abundance of these animals within a given acreage and to compare the use of different types of plant cover by animals.
Cub Scout packs, Boy Scout troops and Explorer posts will be adding finishing touches to their Boy Scout Week activities in February, Vargas said. Cub Scouts will hold their traditional blue and gold banquets. Boy Scouts will put on troop merit

badge shows and courts of honor, and Explorers will hold a variety of celebration events.
