# Democrats Urge Area 'Summit'

Leaders of the four governmental units within the Farmington community were urged this week by the local Democratic Club to meet jointly and talk out their differences over a proposed study of future governmental alternatives.

A statement adopted by the club called for a "summit" conference between the heads of the city and township, plus the villages of Quakertown and Wood Creek Farms.

The Future Farmington Area Study Committee has asked each of the four to share a proportionate amount of the cost of a governmental study to be made by a Michigan State University institute.

The city has formally approved its participation, and both villages are expected to do the same. However, the township board, which must pay the major share of the \$5,000 price, has balked until it can review more than one proposal.

"It seems incredible to us that in an age when we can communicate with the moon, public officials within a few miles of each other aren't able to talk out differences and misunderstandings," said the Democratic statement.

"We would hope the Future Farmington committee would not try to go ahead with the study until cooperation is

pledged by the township.

"This is a highly delicate matter which requires cooperation of all parties involved. If it is to succeed, any separate study by the township alone would fail to serve the needs of the entire community.

"The time has come for all individuals to forget the feuds of the past so that they can jointly plan to meet the common goals of the future."
