Report Petition 12" Water Main

City Manager Dunn reported that a petition had been received for a rezoning of the property located on Drake Road from Grand River to 2,000 feet south. The property was owned by the City and was comprised of more than 62 percent of the frontage on Drake Road. The rezoning was received by the city in 1971 and is now in the rezoning process.

It is necessary that this water main be installed in the proposed Drake Heights Subdivision, where plans are being developed for a 100-unit development.

City Manager John A. Macmillan recommended that the City Council approve Resolution No. 1 authorizing the engineering for this improvement so that a special assessment can be levied on the property. Motion by Peterson supported by Thayer to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 1

WHEREAS, the City of St. Louis is faced with the City Council, duly signed by owners of the frontage of the following property, to construct a sewer extension of 72" water main structures on

Section 5.371 Minimum Design (Design 1)

4(c) Main street shall have a right of way of not less than thirty (30) feet wide and shall be paved with concrete thirty one (31) feet measured from back of curb with the exception of the intersection with the intersection of Family District County Estate, as shown on the map. The City of St. Louis Development shall have a paving width of not less than twenty seven (27) feet for the intersection. The City of St. Louis provided further that there is storage for two (2) vehicles and two (2) additional parking spaces.

AND WHEREAS, the Council deems it necessary to acquire and construct said water main improvements;

1. The City Manager is hereby directed to cause to be prepared plans and specifications for said water main improvements and a detailed estimate of the cost thereof.

2. The City Manager is directed to file the same, together with his recommendations as to what part of the cost thereof should be paid by the City and what part should be paid by the City at large, and the lands which should be included in the Special Assessment District.

The pavement width for the "Alem," the cul-de-sac shall not be less than thirty one (31) feet and the radial potholes shall be less than ten (10) feet with the exception that the pavement width for the stem of the cul-de-sac shall not be less than twenty seven (27) feet. One (1) Family Drive, as to Eatries, and N11, One Family Drive Planned Unit Development.

B. Adoption of Ordinance C-2323 Amending Schedule of Officers and Employees and Establishing of Violation Fines.

There is hereby established a Violation Bureau within the Municipal Court for the City of Farmington for the handling of such violations of ordinances and regulations of the City, or parts thereof, hereinafter prescribed in the Schedule of Offenses as may appear in answer to a charge violating any of the ordinances set forth in the following Schedule of Offenses. Fines may within the time specified in the notice of such charge answer at the Violations Bureau to the charges made against them, or they may elect to plead guilty to the charge, without a hearing in court and giving power
