## Dedication To Mark 7th Anniversary Of Pilgrim Church

Pilgrim Church will observe the seventh anniversary of its founding Sunday with special services dedicating its contemporary styled house of worship at 3061 North Adams Rd. in Bloomfield Twp.

In a departure from tradition, the Congregational group has invited laymen to be the main participants in the dedicatory services that will begin at 4 p.m. A communion service is also scheduled at the church's regular meeting time of 11 a.m.

Pilgrim began when 64 adults and 14 children met for services in a building that now houses the Birmingham Teen Center. Before establishing its permanent location, the members also held services in the Birmingham Community house and the Birmingham YMCA. Church membership today, which numbers 150 adults, comes largely from Birmingham, Bloomfield, Troy, Southfield, Royal Oak and Berkley.

THE LOCAL church is affiliated with the National Association of Congregational Churches, the Michigan Conference of Congregational Churches, and the Southeastern Michigan Association of Congregational Churches. The church was honored recently when its pastor, the Rev. Howard E. Bull, and a member, James K. Flack, were named to leadership posts on boards of the national association.

The \$200,000 facility to be dedicated has been in use as the church meeting house since April 2, 1967. Formal dedication was delayed, however, until permanent furnishings had been installed.

The church was designed by Troy architect Frank Straub, who said his work was intended to express New England tradition through the use of "massing, scale and proportions suggestive of the early church while embodying a contemporary feeling in detail and construction technique." So successful was Straub's efforts that he was awarded a citation for excellence by the American Society of Church Architects.

The main address at the dedication service will be made by George E. Gullen Jr., vice president for public relations of Wayne State University and a member of the First Congregational Church of Detroit. Another First Congregational participant will be Norman O. Stockmeyer Sr., a member of the Wayne State board of governors.

ONE OF THE new clergymen, who will assist at the service is the Rev. Dr. John Claxton, formerly pastor of Plymouth Congregational Church in Lansing and now associate executive secretary of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches.

Others on the dedication program include George A. Schum of Wayne, moderator of the Michigan Conference; Paul Sheldon of Dumore, moderator of the Southeastern Michigan Association; Dr. Philip Lett, president of the Birmingham Area Council of Churches; William A. Robertson of Pontiac; Ellsworth A. Moore, of Lathrup Village; and, as members of Pilgrim, Wallace J. Hendry, William H. Aryston, Howard C. Tuttle, Mrs. Howard W. Reiman and Fritz Flesselman, as well as the pastor, Mr. Bull.

Mr. Bull has been pastor of the church since January 7, 1962. A graduate of the Garrett Theological Institute of Chicago, he formerly ministered to the Baroque Community Church and the Marne Methodist Church, both in western Michigan.
