

Humphrey Jeered By Anti-Americans In Kenya

VICE-PRESIDENT Hubert H. Humphrey was jeered at and threatened by anti-American demonstrators at the Nairobi, Kenya, Africa, airport. The protesters were voicing their displeasure at Humphrey's arrival. Police had to use nightsticks to break up the crowd and four people were arrested. Earlier, in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, Humphrey braved bomb threats to crown the winner of the Miss Ababa beauty contest.

IN A THIRD attack Sunday against a provincial South Vietnamese capital in as many days, Vietcong guerrillas battered a South Vietnamese barracks with 600 rounds of mortar fire. Government sources said that the Vietcong were in control of the capital, Khien Cuong, 21 miles northwest of Saigon, but government troops reclaimed the village by dawn. Meanwhile, on Saturday, 16 U.S. Marines were killed and 46 wounded when guerrillas battled through the

streets of a U.S. held South Vietnamese village.

A SAIGON newspaper has claimed that North Vietnamese President Ho Chi Minh is dead, but his death is being concealed by the communists to avoid a power struggle. The newspaper said that he died sometime in December in a village near Hanoi, of a heart ailment and tuberculosis. U.S. sources had no verification of the report.

PROFESSOR Vladimir Kov-

anov, vice-president of the Russian Academy of Medical Sci-

ences, predicts that cancer will be cured by the end of the century. He said that the prospect of a cure is not in surgery but biological and chemical treatment. The scientist added that some preparations were already undergoing successful tests. Kovanov also predicted that a sure-fire influenza vaccine will be discovered soon. Russia has been hit by epidemics of Asian flu in recent years.

THE SOVIET Union is re-

ported building a menacing rocket potential in the Middle East as a new step in further diversification. St. Russia's strategic delivery system, defense sources said mounting evidence points to a systematic building of Soviet rocketry in the Middle East and Mediterranean. They warned that the move poses a growing threat to western security both to the United States 6th Fleet in the Mediterranean and to the southern and southeast-

ern flanks of the North Atlantic allies.

POPE PAUL has blamed happy marriages on imprudent frivolity and lack of preparation. A message, published at Vatican City to mark the celebration of Italian Family Day Sunday, deplored the unhappy outcome of many marriages "with most sad consequences."

FRENCH FINANCE Minister Michel Debre called America's proposed new curbs on the dollar drain "discriminatory" and said that some of the "useless and unfair" restrictions in the program should be revised. According to official French sources, Debre warned that France might retaliate against American companies operating in France if they felt it was being applied inequitably.

A CROWDED Manchester-London express train smashed into a truck hauling a 125 ton transformer at a grade crossing, killing 13 persons and injuring 50. The train was carrying about 500 passengers and the locomotive and eight of the 10 cars were derailed. Staffordshire, England, police said some passengers were trapped in the wreckage for several hours. The driver of the 60-ton truck and his male escaped unhurt.

U-M Adds Housing For Men

ANN ARBOR -- More residence hall space will be made available to University of Michigan men next fall. In addition, more residence halls will probably be shared by men and coeds.

South Quadrangle, which has been reserved chiefly for freshmen and sophomores, will become a hall mainly for upperclassmen.

These are among several changes recommended to housing director John Feldkamp by a committee of students and housing staff personnel.

THE COMMITTEE had been charged with finding additional room, among the 3,600 existing spaces, for men students.

With the 250-student expansion of the Residential College in East Quadrangle, the housing office had projected that there would be too few men's spaces and too many women's spaces in the residence hall system at the start of the 1968-69 school year.

Accordingly, all-girl Alice Lloyd Hall is recommended to become coeducational next fall. Kleinatueck and Hinsdale houses would remain girls' houses, but Angell and Palmer houses would be reserved for men. In addition, Alice Lloyd would be made available for the Pilot Program, under which students living in the same house may enroll in the same classes.

Oxford Housing, a group of suites, apartments, and co-ops currently only for girls, would also become coeducational in August. Noble House, in Oxford, will be a cooperative for 30 men, and East Seelye will offer apartments to 75 men.

TWO SORORITIES, Alpha Kappa Alpha and Delta Sigma Theta, have asked to occupy two coops in Oxford. Their request is being considered. Mosher Hall is likely to be turned over to men in August 1969, when the Residential College displaces more men from East Quad. But Jordan Hall, which adjoins Mosher, will remain a women's residence.

The committee recommended that unmarried sophomores women under 21 continue to be required to live in University housing.
