Lawyer Raps 'For Sale' Sign On Dr. Clark Clinic

A Detroit attorney this week
 branded the appearance of a
 "for sale" sign on the Farm-
 ington Township medical clinic
 occupied by Dr. Ronald E. Clark
 as "completely unauthorized." He
 immediately demanded its
 removal.

The attorney, Abel J. Sel-
 burn, who represents the estate
 of the property's deceased
 owner, Mrs. Hannah Bower-
 bank, expressed a demand
 when informed that on the front
 of the building at 30735 Grand
 River there appeared over the
 weekend a sign which reads:

"For Sale. Write: Dr. R.E.
 Clark."

The administrator of the es-
 tate, William H. Winsper, of
 Maybahl, Mich., who is Mrs.
 Bowerbank's brother, confirmed
 that he had not authorized the
 for sale sign either.

Dr. Clark occupied the clinic,
 which is labeled the "Farm-
 ington Medical Group," until
 his arrest Nov. 16 on a charge
 of manslaughter resulting from
 the Nov. 3 death of a part-
 time nurse. The prosecution
 contends the death of Mrs.
 Grace Nell, 43, of Livonia,
 was from an overdose of sodium
 pentothal administered by
 Dr. Clark.

The physician currently is
 free under \$15,000 bond.

At one time, Mrs. Bower-
 bank also worked for Dr. Clark.
 She died at her Detroit resi-
 dence last March 30, and her
 death is one of several being
 investigated by Oakland County
 Prosecutor S. Jerome Bron-
 son. Her attending physician
 was Dr. Clark, but the death
 went unreported for three
 months.

In 1957, Mrs. Bowerbank and
 Dr. Clark bought the Grand
 River property jointly. The
 Bowerbank woman then bought
 out Dr. Clark's interest in 1962,
 but the physician continued to
 occupy the building.

According to Selburn, the
 Wayne County Probate Court
 has appointed two appraisers
 to determine the value of the
 property and the building. Not
 until they submit a report as to
 its market value will the

parcel be put up for sale, and
 then it will be with a registered
 real estate broker, he said.
 Meanwhile, Selburn has writ-

ten Dr. Clark and his wife,
 demanding they cease any un-
 authorized steps to dispose of
 the property.
