GOV. ROMNEY said he will abide by the State Supreme Court's ruling that his removal of Maj. Gen. Ronald D. McDonald, an adjutant general two years ago, a "contrary to law", but will fire McDonald just as soon as he can. Romney had charged McDonald with malfeasance, misfeasance and gross neglect of duty. McDonald stands to collect between \$60,000 and \$70,000 in back salary and allowances.

SARAH SCURTI, 21, of Detroit, and Nancy Poplawski, 19, of Detroit, were killed when their car was struck by a pickup truck and another auto while making a left turn from Harper into Lakeview. They were struck broadside first by the truck which police say was driven by Herman Klave, 22, of Detroit, and then by the car that was allegedly driven by Herman's brother, Gary, 19. The two fled on foot and were later apprehended through identification by the license plates. They will be charged with manslaughter and leaving the scene of an accident.

BACKERS OF THE state open housing law have started a campaign to push for passage of the measure and a special Governor's Commission on Crime has submitted a list of 25 recommendations for anti-crime and anti-riot measures, asking Romney to submit them to the Legislature for action which all proves that these two issues coupled with lower court reorganization will be things which will dominate the 1968 regular session of the Michigan Congress.

THE 58-YEAR-OLD former "boy wonder" of Michigan politics and governor for six consecutive terms until 1960, G. Mennen Williams, says he is not seriously considering anything at the moment but he has left open possibility of running for public office again. He has decided against seeking an Upper Peninsula congressional seat and has laid aside plans for running for the Michigan Supreme Court or seeking appointment to the federal bench.

DR. IRA POLLEY, state superintendent of public education, reported that almost 60 Michigan school districts may end the fiscal year in June with a deficit. He told the State Board of Education that closing of the Inkster district for lack of funds would be "unthinkable." Inkster threatened earlier to close its schools if the Legislature didn't pass a bill to allow it to borrow money in anticipation of next year's state aid.

WALTER BARE, owner-operator of Walter's Market, 5849 St. Aubin, Detroit, is in fair condition in Detroit General Hospital after he was shot in the neck in a gun duel with a bandit who dropped the loot in the store during his escape. Bare told police that he tried to outwit the gunman who pulled a gun on him. He asked the thief not to shoot him and then

pulled his own pistol from behind the counter and fired but missed.

★ GEORGE ROMNEY is brimming with confidence that he will do substantially well in the New Hampshire primary even though Richard M. Nixon will reportedly go into the race a 3-1 favorite. Romney said that he would be satisfied with nothing less than victory in the March 12 primary.

★ ROY L. REUTHER, brother of United Auto Workers president Walter Reuther, died Wednesday in Metropolitan Hospital of a heart attack. Reuther, 58, born in Wheeling, W. Va., worked with brothers Walter and Victor to organize the UAW in Detroit in the early 1930's. Surviving are his wife, Fania, two sons, his mother, three brothers, and a sister.

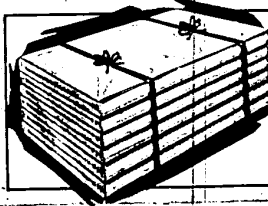
