Clarenceville Methodist Sets Two Missions Talks

Two leaders in the field of missions will speak in the Clarenceville Methodist Church, 20300 Middle Belt, Livonia, on Sunday, Jan. 21.

Bishop J. Waskom Pickett, retired missionary to India, will be the guest speaker in the morning services at 9 and 11:15 a.m., and the Rev. Raymond Lamb, pastor of St. Paul's Methodist Church, Monroe, will speak at the first session of the church's School of Missions in the evening.

The school will open with a pot-luck supper at 6:30 p.m., and the ministers' talk will follow.

The Rev. Lamb was chairman of the Detroit Methodist Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension for four years and presently serves the conference world service and finance committee. He was

a delegate to the World Methodist Conference in London in 1956.

BISHOP PICKETT, now a resident of Dearborn, is regarded as one of the top authorities on Christian missions in India and around the world. During 46 years in India, Dr. Pickett served as pastor, district superintendent, editor, publisher, secretary of Regional and National Christian Councils, and bishop.

He was for over 20 years president of the Councils on Medical Work and Education of the Methodist Church in Southern Asia, and was closely associated with many of its most successful educational and medical missionary institutions in India, Burma and Pakistan.

He was the organizer and first president of the United Christian Mission to Nepal, which built up a missionary force of more than a hundred, and now runs three hospitals and several educational institutions in that Himalayan kingdom, which was previously not allowed the entry of missionaries.

BISHOP PICKETT HAS known the leaders of India during its long struggle for independence since he conferred often with Mahatma Gandhi and Pandit Nehru before independence, and was frequently consulted during the preparation of the present constitution.
