Players Announce 'Anastasia' Cast

Mrs. Cecil Orman, a home-maker and substitute teacher, has been cast in the lead role of the play, "Anastasia," to be presented three weekends by the Farmington Players opening Feb. 2 in the Players' Barn.

"Anastasia" is the drama of a woman purporting to be the real Russian princess believed to have escaped from the mass revolutionary assassination of her family, and it involves a conspiracy to gain the royal inheritance if living relatives can be convinced of her validity.

Mrs. Orman has worked with the Players a number of years and directed last season's production of "Moby Moon."

"ANASTASIA" is being directed by Merle Pedicini, assisted by Joanne Kama, with Don Briggs as producer. The complete cast of the drama was announced this week.

Playing the role of Prince-Bouline, one of the conspirators, is Richard Pedicini, vice-president of a Bloomfield Hills advertising agency who majored in drama at U.C.L.A. He last was seen as Iago in "Othello."

Hope Nahotki, another Farmington Players veteran, has been cast as the Dowager Empress whose acceptance of Anastasia is sought as the prime goal of the conspiracy. Last season Mrs. Nahotki directed "A Shot in the Dark." She also is head of the costume department.

Leonard (Bud) Stone will play the role of Chernov, one of the conspirators. He has appeared in many Players productions, and was seen last season as the mayor in "Never Too Late."

The two other conspirators, Counselor Drivinski and Petrovich, will be portrayed by George Mullin, manager of a Detroit trust company, and Dennis Broadway, a young actor who has been cast as men of all ages and types in previous Players productions.

Bob Thomas, writer and editor with a Detroit film company, will play Dr. Serensky, and Joseph Papp, an attorney, is cast as Prince Paul.
