Bonstelle Books 'Tattoo'

"The Rose Tattoo," a Tennessee Williams drama of human frailty and frustration, will open at Wayne State University's Bonstelle Theatre at 8:30 p.m. Friday, Jan. 26.

Additional performances are scheduled Saturday night, Jan. 27, and Thursday through Sunday of the second week, Feb. 1-4. All performances are at 8:30 p.m., except the Sunday matinee which begins at 2:30 p.m.

"The Rose Tattoo" is a vividly theatrical play about a simple woman's illusions and how they are shattered. A play of mood, it takes place in the strange atmosphere of a Sicilian colony where the incongruities of setting and mood make the play both comic and sympathetic.

Playing the role of Serafina, the woman whose fierce pride is destroyed in this warmly personal Williams drama, is Barbara Ann Lakon, a senior speech major at Wayne State. Other leading roles will be played by Denise Abood, Ted Davis, Richard Edwards, Robert Robb and Mary Traczko.

The play is being directed by Robert T. Hazzard with sets by Russell Smith and costumes by Janice Snodgrass.

"The Rose Tattoo" is the third Bonstelle production of the current season. Three more plays will open later--Max Frisch's "Andorra," March 1, Brian Friel's "Philadelphia, Here I Come," April 12, and Peter Shaffer's "The Royal Hunt of the Sun," May 17.

Individual tickets at \$2 are available at the university ticket office, at all J.L. Hudson's stores and Grinnell's downtown.

Low Income Not Real Poverty Guide

Merely counting the number of people with substandard incomes does not give an accurate measure of poverty, a University of Michigan economist insists.

Prof. James N. Morgan suggested at the American Economic Association meeting last week that each family in a representative sample should be asked not only its money income, but also its equity in service-producing assets such as homes, its total hours of paid and unpaid work, its illness and unemployment experience, and its desires for more or less work.

Each of these factors is part

of the "well-offness" of a family, according to Prof. Morgan, a program director in the Survey Research Center of U-M's

Institute for Social Research.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS from Morgan's report:

When people were asked whether they would like to work more hours a week, more than

a third said yes. Among the relatively uneducated and unskilled, more than half said that they would like more work.
