## Foundation Arranges Exchange Grant

ANN ARBOR—An exchange scholarship between The University of Michigan and Magdalen College of Cambridge University in England has been established by the Power Foundation of Ann Arbor.

The scholarship will be given to one American and one British graduate each year, starting next fall. Each recipient will hold the award for two years.

According to terms of the scholarship, The University of Michigan Marshall Selection Committee will select three candidates for the fellowship, and the master of Magdalen College will also nominate three. Final selection of the two recipients, one from each institution, will be made by the Power Foundation.

THE FOUNDATION was established by Eugene B. Power, a former University of Michigan Regent and an Honorary Fellow of Magdalen College and his family.

Recipients will be free to follow any course of study available at the exchange institution.

For the American student, the scholarship grant will include tuition and other academic fees at Magdalen College, one round-trip ticket across the Atlantic, board and room, and 500 pounds (\$1,600) per year.

Similar provisions, adjusted to reflect differing costs of living, will apply for the student coming to Michigan.

Because Magdalen is a men's college, only unmarried male students at U-M will be eligible to apply.

THE AMERICAN recipient will be provided rooms in Magdalen College.

## SHC Seeks Help From Planners

LANSING -- The cooperation of land use planners to help curb the rising cost of highway construction has been urged by the State Highway Commission.

John P. Woodford, Deputy State Highway Director, said the supply of sand, gravel and crushed stone suitable for use in paving Michigan highways is being choked off by restrictive zoning.

"Unless new sources are permitted to develop, we will be forced to haul these materials longer distances at greater cost to the taxpayer," he said.

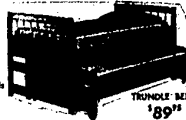
