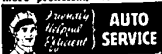


Girl Scouts Change Organizational Setup

mind a plan was worked out to get help and information to the leaders on a more direct route from the council.

All of the Farmington-Norfolk District will be known as the Farmington-Norfolk Area under the direction of an Area Chairman. There will be no separate Neighborhoods and no Neighborhood Chairmen.

Oakland Introduces 50 New Non-Credit Courses

More than 50 new non-credit courses in a wide variety of subjects are being offered for the spring semester by Oakland University's Continuing Education Division.

Most classes begin the week of Feb. 19 and will be held evenings from Monday to Thursday on the university campus.

Courses range from such nuts-and-bolts subjects as "Machine Design" to those that have great topical significance.

Among the latter is a political science course in "The Philosophy and Practice of Non-Violence and Civil Disobedience," to be taught by Richard W. Brooks.

In all, the 200 courses scheduled for the spring term represent 50 disciplines, including liberal arts, engineering, science, accounting, business, and finance and municipal administration.

THE CONTINUING Education Division continues its strong curriculum in real estate with 17 courses to be taught by specialists in this field. A new offering, "Review Appraisal," will be taught by William

Voss, chief district appraiser of the Michigan Highway Department.

A second field in which the Continuing Education Division provides a broad selection is computers. "Introduction to Systems Analysis," to be taught by R.K. Buffett of the Ford Motor Company, gives the student a practical work project to complete during the term.

A total of 18 course offerings are available in the computer curriculum.

In the humanities field, two new courses have been scheduled. "Great Ages of Man: The Romantic Period" is the fourth of a five-semester series on Western Civilization. "Jewish History Since the Civil War," taught by Rabbi Ernest J. Conrad, will be conducted at the Birmingham Community House.

New courses in the fields of education, art history, mathematics, music, political science and science have expanded the selection provided in the liberal arts field.

SIMILARLY, the curriculum in the business and professional development program has been broadened. Five new courses have been added in the field of management, while four

new courses in the industrial field are also available.

Another new course is "Labor Relations in Public Administration," to be taught by Nicholas Santavirta, director of personnel for the City of Pontiac. This is one of four new courses in the field of municipal administration.
