

Boston Fire Kills Nine; Propose Senate Dial-Vote

National News Round Up

WASHINGTON—Sen. Russell B. Long proposes a dial-a-vote system to speed decision-making in the Senate. His objective: A system which would permit senators who are away from the floor to vote by telephone on bills and have their votes counted.

MIAMI—Patrolman Jerry P. Edwards, 27, has resigned and Patrolman John Creekmore, 23, was suspended over an incident in which a 17-year-old Negro boy allegedly was stripped to his shorts and dangled from a highway overpass by his heels. Police Chief Walter E. Hougherty said the two white patrolmen allegedly stripped the boy on a street in a Negro district of Miami.

MIAMI—Nine persons were killed in a pre-dawn fire Sunday that destroyed a \$2-a-night transient hotel in the south end. A fire official described the fire as the city's worst hotel blaze. At least 15 persons were injured in the Hotel Roosevelt.

LA JOLLA, Calif.—Black Grigg, while taking underwater photographs in the ocean 70 feet below surface a half mile off La Jolla, was injured by a 25-foot gray whale after it flicked its tail and struck the man, who had reached out and touched it.

CONCORD, N.H.—Richard M. Nixon has launched his campaign for the GOP nomination for president in 1968 by being very versatile in his first three days in New Hampshire. He said, "I'll try to use television in state of my past record or that score."

MANCHESTER, N.H.—George Romney, hunting for votes for the March 12 presidential primary, has bypassed the banquet hall for the living room, the street corner and the street cafeteria. He says, "We're not to get this country back on the track, and I know I can do it."

BOSTON—Actor Tony Curtis nursed a broken nose after he was injured Saturday inspecting an area near Boston Commons to be used in a chase scene for "The Boston Strangler." One of two stunt men was testing the strength of a fence when a loose board flew back and hit Curtis.

VIRGINIA BEACH—Police arrested 62 persons at this Atlantic resort in a week-long series of raids aimed at stemming an outbreak of traffic in narcotics at city high schools.

WASHINGTON—The House Ways and Means Committee heard a proposal from Secretary of the Treasury Henry Fowler which includes excise tax on tickets for overseas travel and a tax on tourist spending, with an exemption intended to help low-budget travelers like students and teachers, and exempting travel in the Western Hemisphere.

WASHINGTON—Confessing a "serious error," Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara volunteered that he and all other advisors of the late President Kennedy lacked the disastrous Bay of Pigs invasion in Cuba in 1961.

WINTER PARK, Fla.—The body of Edward John Gurney III, son of Rep. Edward J. Gurney (R-Ill.) was found in his automobile near New Smyrna Beach Sunday night. Police said that Gurney had shot himself to death through the temple with a .22 rifle.

BOSTON—Doctors allowed Gov. Lawrence Wallace, of Alabama, to leave M.D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute. Mrs. Wallace had completed four weeks of radiation treatment for a pelvic tumor.

BOSTON—Boston hospital and medical schools plan to drive to recruit donors of hearts, kidneys, livers and other organs for use in research and transplant operations.
