

Rusk, McNamara Aiming For 'Pueblo' Settlement

WASHINGTON--Secretary of State Dean Rusk and Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara appear to be paving the way for a possible U.S. apology to North Korea if that is essential to recover the captured Pueblo vessel and her crew. The possibilities of a U.S. apology to North Korea and a Pentagon-Congressional battle surfaced last Sunday when Rusk and McNamara appeared together on a radio-television interview reportedly suggested by President Johnson.

COPENHAGEN -- Pretty Princess Benedikte, Denmark's last unwed princess, Saturday married German Prince Heinrich Casimir Karl August Konstantin zu Wittgenstein.

LONDON--Prime Minister Harold Wilson's trip to see President Johnson later this week came under heavy criticism as ill-timed and ill-conceived. Wilson is to meet with Johnson at the White House Thursday and Friday.

PARIS--An appeal to university scientists in the United States to bar military research from their laboratories was issued Sunday by 428 French and Japanese scientists. They warned that researchers in their countries would break their ties with American universities if this work continued.

PARIS--French Foreign Minister Maurice Coure de Murville had a 20 minute talk with German Ambassador to France Manfred Kalber over the weekend to receive an explanation of a statement purported to have been made by German Foreign Minister Willy Brandt which slighted President Charles de Gaulle. Brandt was supposed to have said, "French-German friendship, which is particularly vibrant among youth, will wind up being stronger than the rigid and anti-European conceptions of a chief of state thirsty for power," Brandt denied saying this.

DAI LOC, Vietnam--The Vietnam winter monsoon season is upon the land and the heavy rainfalls have given American soldiers maximum misery and danger. Mud is everywhere and sickness becomes more prevalent at this time.

ALICE SPRINGS, Australia --A big United States - Australian space research base is expected to be in operation near Alice Springs sometime in 1969. The base is likely to be involved in tracking of unmanned "spy" satellites and the evaluation of the military effectiveness of men in space.

TEL AVIV--Israel officially declared the submarine Dakar and her 60-man crew lost--11 days after the vessel disappeared in the eastern Mediterranean.

WORLD ROUNDUP

SEOUL--A secret U.S.-North Korean meeting Sunday may have paved the way for "substantial headway" toward release of the USS Pueblo's crew, including agreement on returning the dead and injured. A spokesman for the U.S. forces in Korea neither confirmed nor denied reports of such a meeting at Panmunjom.

WASHINGTON--Secretary of State Dean Rusk said Sunday that three times in the past three years, Soviet warships intruded within three miles of shore of U.S. waters. Rusk said that in each case the Russian ship was asked to leave, it did not give any details.

NICOSIA--A British Olympic Airways Comet jetliner with undercarriage trouble crash landed at the Royal Air Force station in South Cyprus Sunday night. No one was injured.

SAIGON--Thirty-four missionaries were rescued from their hilltop mission in the resort town of Dalat by U.S. forces a short time before it was overrun by the Viet Cong. The missionaries including 14 women, 11 men and 9 children were pinned down in the mission compound when rescued. The mission was operated by the Christian Missionary Alliance and the Overseas Crusade.

SAIGON--South Vietnamese planes bombed the ancient citadel of Hue Sunday and the beginning of the week but apparently failed to open the thick walls surrounding the city to allow forces to enter the city and rout the Communists. The U.S. command in Saigon disclosed for the first time that U.S. Marines have been fighting on the eastern end of the demilitarized zone since last Tuesday after an amphibious landing.

MILAN--Clement Gubbay, an international pharmaceutical dealer, denied a charge that he had sold to South Vietnam plain seawater for which the United States paid \$21,000. Gubbay declared the substance is "true and proper medicine."

MIAMI--The Havana Revolutionary Tribunal announced Saturday it has sentenced the old-line Cuban Communist Anibal Escalante to 15 years in prison. Escalante was named in a Havana radio broadcast, mentioned in Miami as the head of an anti-party group conspiring against the Cuban revolution.

COPENHAGEN -- Hilmar Baunsgaard was elected in a landslide vote Jan. 23 as the new Prime Minister of Denmark. Baunsgaard heads the first non-socialist government in 15 years.

TOKYO--The Tokyo newspaper Yomiuri said one of its staffers photographed another U.S. spy ship, the Banner, cruising off the Korean peninsula in the Sea of Japan Friday near the U.S. aircraft carrier Ranger.

GENEVA--The Vatican denied that Pope Paul VI is going to make a trip to Moscow. The rumors flew on and off ever since the Pontiff received Soviet President Nikolai V. Podgorny in an audience at the Vatican Jan. 30, 1967.

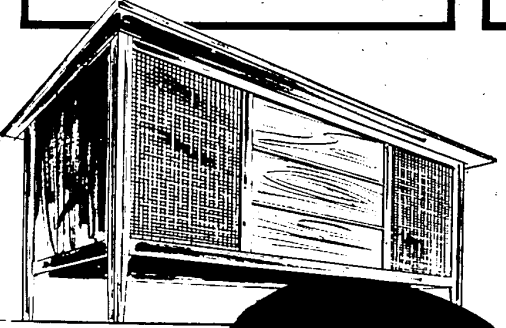

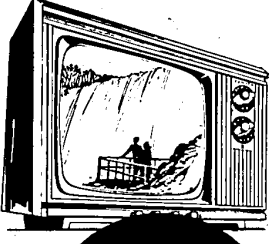
