Albion Students Explore Grenoble

Fourteen Albion College students, accompanied by four students from Hope College, left February 5 for the site of the 1968 Winter Olympics in Grenoble, France—but their goal will be learning the language, not the slopes.

For the second year the students will be attending the French language school of the University of Grenoble. There they will begin a "maximum immersion" course in French that will also include intensive exposure to French culture.

Residence Donated To U Of D

The \$350,000 Fisher home in Palmer Woods has been donated by Mrs. Alfred J. Fisher, Sr., to the University of Detroit as a special conference center. The residence at 1771 Balmoral Drive, formerly the home of the late A.J. Fisher, will be used by U. of D. for top-level conferences and meetings. It will be known as the University of Detroit President's House.
