

McDonald.. Safety Neglected

Congressman Jack McDonald (R-19th District) is taking the Johnson Administration to task for requesting more funds for highway beautification than for safety.

McDonald's criticism was contained in a recent statement attacking Johnson's proposed budget, deficits and proposed tax increases.

"Said McDonald:

"HE OFFERS an incredible \$185 billion budget—with a planned deficit of \$3 billion—binging on his hope that Congress will enact a tax increase that will fake another \$12 billion from the taxpayers. In other words, the President's budget anticipates a \$20 billion deficit if the tax increase is not forthcoming.

"At a time of inflation, the President proposes to continue massive domestic spending in areas that might well be put off for a while.

"It is the old tax and spend theory, with the middle income American—the great bulk of the nation that has no lobby—picking up the burden.

"THE PRESIDENT is asking for \$20.3 million for a traffic and safety program that the nation's foremost authorities have said will drastically reduce the annual toll of deaths and injuries. This worthwhile effort reaches right down to the community level, including driver training courses and funds for improved safety procedures.

"But he wants \$51 million for beautification.

"This shocking disparity requires no comment."

Sen. Kuhn Against Offices

State Sen. George W. Kuhn (R-West Bloomfield) says he is opposed to the establishment of home offices by senators.

"The cost of \$18,000 per Senator would amount to almost \$700,000 for just the Senate alone," said Kuhn, "should the 110 members of the House of Representatives be included, the cost would be three times that of the Senate and would amount to almost three million dollars altogether. I do not believe that the benefits are commensurate with the expenditure involved.

"MORE IMPORTANTLY, this is an unnecessary expenditure at a time when we have greater financial demands and needs for such state programs as education, mental health, police and law enforcement. These particular problems should have highest priority and should be met first."

Sen. Kuhn said he felt that the proposal to permit establishment of home offices should be first considered by the Senate Appropriations Committee, because the people and the Senate should know the fiscal implications.

Sen. Kuhn recalled that Medicaid was "sold to the legislature without any indications of possible costs." He noted that it started the first year at a cost of \$12 million, rose to \$20 million the next year and to \$65 million this year.

"In the future, we will be appropriating more than \$100 million a year, and it is now being the control of the legislature. We cannot accept the concept of approving something without information, rules and other necessary data.

"THIS IS ANOTHER by-product or result of what happens in government when we get a state income tax without any control and limitation.

"This is one of the many reasons I opposed the state income tax last year. The people are getting pretty concerned and tired of the government increasing income taxes at all levels, national, state and local.
