Rep. Ford Hails Loan Bill Win

Congressman William Ford (D-15th District) hailed the adoption of a long-troubled lending bill as a "great victory for American consumers."

Congressman Ford was co-sponsor of the legislation, which was approved Thursday by the House of Representatives with only four dissenting votes. It had already been approved by the Senate. In a somewhat weaker version, and agreement will be held to settle differences.

THE BILL STATES, simply, that whenever a consumer buys or buys on time, he must be told clearly and fully how much it will cost him to charge. It rather than pay cash.

Ford said that the House bill eliminated exemptions included in the Senate version for department stores revolving credit, and for purchases where the total credit charge is less than \$10.

The House retained a Senate provision setting sharp restrictions on pay garnishments. The section forbids garnishment of the first \$20 of any person's weekly pay check, and permits only up to 10 per cent of the remainder. These restrictions would apply only to garnishments for unpaid debts, excluding taxes and family support.

"UNDER THIS legislation, Congressman Ford said, "the home buyer must be given the total interest charges over the life of the mortgage; he must be told in advance, when he needs a home improvement loan, whether he is granting a second mortgage on his home."

Department stores must limit their interest charges on unpaid bills at an annual rate, rather than monthly. Advertisers could no longer issue such selling offers as \$1 down and \$14.99, without revealing the annual interest rate and total cost of credit.

"This legislation will save American consumers many millions of dollars," Ford said. "It will not inconvenience or hurt the honest business man, but it will make it difficult for the loan shark or unscrupulous operator to take advantage of unsuspecting buyers."

WSU Plans Start Of Med Bldg

One of the most significant events in the history of Michigan medicine will be observed at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 14, when a groundbreaking ceremony is held for the new \$24 million Basic Science Building of Wayne State University's School of Medicine.

The structure will be the largest state building ever constructed in terms of both cost and size. It will be only slightly smaller than Detroit's Cobo Hall. Total building area is 482,510 gross square feet located on a 5.17 acre site.

A teaching-research facility, the structure will be built in the University's new Medical Center. It will rise on a site at the southeast corner of Canfield and Brush, 12 blocks away and 100 years in time from WSU's first medical building which housed the Detroit Medical College. The University's founding ties to the first medical classes held in this structure in 1868.

Leading local, state and national officials will participate in the groundbreaking ceremony for the new facility.

Auto Sales Slump Hits Vehicle Titles

LANSING—A slump in auto sales during 1967 resulted in a similar downturn in the number of vehicle titles processed by the Michigan Department of State.

For the first time since 1963, the number of titles failed to reach two million, said Secretary of State James M. Hare. Some 1.9-million titles were processed, including 400,000 for new vehicles and 1,079,000 transfers.

Hare noted that the largest number of titles ever processed was 2,160,000 in 1965. "We've come a long way from the 222,000 titles we handled in 1921, the first year the state had any records," said Hare.

There are more than 4.7-million motor vehicles used in Michigan, and nearly 6-million drivers.
