KNOWN AS "EXCURSIONS in Music," the program is available to the school for a \$50 donation to a group known as Detroit Adventure. Individual PTAs have made it financially possible for Farmington schools to enjoy this musical experience.

musicians, the balance of the tab is picked up by a number of Detroit business, industrial and service organizations which comprise the sponsoring body.

At Wooddale School, where a brass quartet was heard last Monday, the reception by third through sixth graders was "terrific," according to Principal Donald Cowan. When the youthful audience was invited to participate by clapping in rhythm, it brought down the house.
