Meals will be paid for by the Bentley Funds, raised by various activities to finance the 700 miles of travel and the expenses not provided by the communities visited. The charter bus costs \$900. The food bill is estimated at \$256.75 for Tuesday supper, Wednesday breakfast and Thursday lunch.

THE TRIP is intended to promote interest in choral music, emphasize the fine arts in public school curriculum, deepen interest in music education, among other benefits.
