The best word out of Ann Arbor is that either Bump Elliott, the football coach, or Don Canham, the track coach, will get the post. Canham appears to have the inside track.

The Wolverines rallied to top Illinois, 67-65, on a basket by Bob Sullivan and free throw by Dennis Stewart in the final 30 seconds of action.
