Dunham Break-In Brings 2 Arrests

One of the Farmington area's major suppliers of sporting goods, Dunham's, Inc., 33096 Northwestern Highway, saw the arrest of two Detroit men last weekend while the pair allegedly were engaged in the theft of at least a dozen handguns.

Arthur King, 23, and Charles Hoover, 20, both of whom gave

their address as 59 Alfred, a Detroit hotel, have been charged with breaking and entering after they were found hiding in a storage room by West Bloomfield police at about 4 a.m. Feb. 16. Police say they had the guns in their possession when apprehended.

Examination in West Bloomfield justice court has been scheduled for Feb. 22, but police have stated that inasmuch as both men have requested court-appointed counsel a postponement is likely.

Broken glass in front of the store, spotted by police on routine patrol, led to their capture. The store is located in West Bloomfield Township, just north of the Farmington Township boundary where Northwestern Highway joins Orchard Lake Rd.

This was the store's fourth break-in within a year. Two weeks ago, 10 rifles and shot guns, plus five pistols, were stolen and the thieves still are at large. Perpetrators of two earlier Dunham burglaries have been arrested and sentenced to prison, according to police.

County Takes Pine Orders

Orders for six species of Pine tree seedlings are being taken by the Oakland County Soil Conservation District. They include Austrian Pine, Red Pine, Scotch Pine, White Pine, Norway Spruce and Blue Spruce.

The trees will be available sometime between April 1 and April 15. Those who order trees will be notified of the time and place to pick them up.

I-96 Hit-Run Victim 'Critical'

A 17-year-old Farmington Township youth fought for his life this week after being critically injured in a 1968 hit-run accident while hitchhiking to Lansing.

Felix Gerald Droz, of 2474 Alycekey, which runs north from 12 Mile Rd. between Middle Belt and Orchard Lake Rds., was struck Feb. 18 while standing at the side of the freeway near the Wixom ramp. Droz was rushed to Botsford

General Hospital where early this week a spokesman said his condition is listed as "critical." Wixom police said the youth had suffered multiple fractures, including a skull fracture.

The lad had been enrolled as a senior in North Farmington High School at the start of the school year, but dropped out during the first semester without explanation, according to school officials.

Under arrest on a felony charge of leaving the scene of a personal injury accident is John Henry Savers, 26, of 1423 Blaine, Detroit. He was apprehended within hours after the accident by Wixom police acting on information provided by witnesses to the accident.

Savers is being held in Oakland County Jail in lieu of \$5,000 bond and is scheduled to appear for examination Feb. 27 in Wixom justice court.

Township OK's Levy On Sewers

Installation of sanitary sewers along Medbury and Hemlock Sts. in Farmington Township was approved by the Board of Trustees after a public hearing Monday night.

Waste System Expansion Set

A contract for an estimated \$21 million will be awarded this year by the Detroit Metropolitan Water Services agency to start construction of a Macomb-Oakland County interceptor system to reduce waste water pollution.

The interceptor will make waste water treatment service available to 10 Macomb County communities and will connect with Oakland County's planned Clinton-Oakland Interceptor which will serve West Bloomfield, Avon, Independence, Oakland, Pontiac and Waterford Townships.

A dozen residents of the affected area north of 10 Mile Rd. and east of Middle Belt Rd. appeared before the trustees but voiced no organized opposition to the plan.

The trustees then confirmed a special assessment roll covering 50 lots on the two streets. Cost of the project will be an estimated \$74,500 with assessments spread across a 15-year period.

It is expected that work will be completed by next fall, and it will be started as soon as approval is received from the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission.

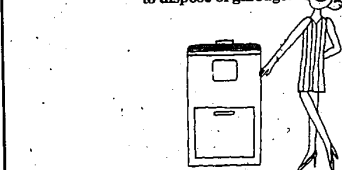
