Hail to the champions!
 It was taken for granted that Bentley High would capture the 1968 basketball championship of the Suburban Six League but even Coach George Fefies didn't realize his team had clinched the crown in the one-sided 72-46 victory over Allen Park Friday.

Falcons' Rally Nips Stevenson

It's been repeatedly said: "No sports attraction is finished until the final siren sounds."
 How true!
 Take Friday night's Farmington-Stevenson basketball battle in the Interlakes Conference.
 After one quarter, it was strictly Stevenson. The Livonians led, 16-7.
 But in as dramatic a finish as the prep cage wars have produced anywhere this season, Farmington squeezed out a 59-57 victory when Mark Lynott after being the game with an eight-foot jumper hit on two free throws with a second to go for the payoff.
 Farmington resorted to a full-court press in the last period to outscore Stevenson, 23-8, in the closing eight minutes of action.
 "OUR BOYS really did the job wonderfully," smiled a happy Ray Boyles, the Farmington coach.
 Across the way, Coach George Van Wagner of Stevenson scratched his head. He was mystified.
 "We knew exactly what they would do," he explained. "It was part of our game plan to work against a press."
 "We had men clear, but somehow we just couldn't get the ball to the right man."
 "As a result, we were the victims of costly steals."
 Some missed free throws in the last minute also proved costly to Stevenson.
 "We had a chance to wrap it up," moaned Van Wagner.
 Stevenson had exploded at the outset with Paul Transmasher personally outscoring Farmington, 10-7, in the first quarter.
 In the second period, Jim Olsen and Jerry Dettler clicked for six points each to make it a 32-16 score. Farmington had been held at this point to only seven baskets and two free throws.
 RANDY CLEVELAND helped perk Farmington up in the third period when he dropped in 10 points. Then it was Lynott and Lynott and Lynott some more that brought Farmington roaring back in the final seconds.
 Lynott made 13 of his 19 points in the last period to top the winners, who now have a 5-2 record in the Interlakes League and are assured of a second-place finish behind champion Pontiac Northern.

 Against the Parkers, Walt Blacha and Ken Bollin were the big gunners in the opening period when Bentley moved ahead, 15-8.
 Marc Chasson and Dan Doyle sparked in the second stanza when Bentley widened the gap to 32-18, one of the lowest halftime scores of the year.
 THE PARKERS WENT completely cold in the third period and had only three free throws for their efforts in six minutes as Bentley held a 42-22 lead that was trimmed to 42-26 when Chuck Heaney hit twice from outside for Parkers.
 The game opened up in the final eight minutes when Coach Fefies inserted every member of the varsity squad. It was all offense from that point with the result that Bentley held a 30-point edge at one point, 69-39.
 Bollin topped the scoring for the winners with 16 points followed by Blacha with 14, Doyle and Chasson with 12 each. Johnny Cabavahan was high for the Parkers with five field goals and 10 free throws for 20.
