This was the highlight of a report given to Westland Mayor Thomas Brown by a private plant location consulting

by a private plant location consulting firm.

Theodore L. Doman, of T.L. Doman Associates in Birmingham, wrote Brown that to realize the benefits of industrial development, 'the present well-organized development efforts of Westland must be scaled to practical efforts.

"Dreams of Westland becoming a research center and the hopes of a large company locating here must be tempered," advised Doman.

"Serious efforts should be directed toward immediate development of the land and solicitation of many smaller companies allied with the Detroit area's primary activity, auto manufacturing,

primary activity, auto manufacturing, metal fabricating, and industrial dis-tribution."

DOMAN ALSO POINTED OUT in his wo-page report that he has outlined
