## Three Boys Achieve Rank Of Eagle Scout

Three members of Farmington Township Boy Scout Troop 263 were elevated to the rank of Eagle Scout at a mid-year court of honor held in Kenbrook school on Feb. 21.

The boys who have reached the highest rank in Scouting are Lawrence W. Acciaoli, Steven A. Acciaoli and Timothy V. Schafer.

out scientific details which are regarded as the rules of the game. The goal is to bring about statewide uniformity both in processes and conclusions, and the professionals claim this has been accomplished.

The guidelines they must follow are minutely defined in regard to every type and size of construction, every living facility, and in regard to open land everything from nature of the topography to market proximity.

THE FIRST RULE in Michigan assessment procedures is found in Act 400 of the Public Acts of 1965, Section 27 reads, in part:

"Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, except as hereinafter provided, property shall be assessed to 50 per cent of its true cash value in accordance with article nine, section three of the constitution."

This demands that assessing officers be as attuned to market values in their communities as to structural costs.

The assessment and equalization process begins with the assessors and ends with the state tax commission.

On Monday, March 5, in every one of nearly 1,800 separate assessment districts in Michigan the locally appointed Board of Review will start its study of the rolls. The board has the authority to alter an individual assessment where it finds an inequity, but it may not make across-the-board adjustments.

IN APRIL the County Board of Supervisors must determine whether the property in each township and city has been equally and uniformly assessed.
